SPECIAL SPEED REGULATION NO. 630

Highway Location: EDGARTOWN
Authority in Control: TOWN OF EDGARTOWN
Name of Highway(s): Vineyard Haven-Edgartown Rd.

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 90, Section 18, of the General Laws (Ter. Ed.) as amended, the following Special Speed Regulation is

hereby Adopted
by the Board of Selectmen
of the Town of Edgartown

That the following speed limits are established at which motor vehicles may be operated in the areas described:

Special Speed Regulation number 270 dated July 7, 1964 is hereby amended by striking out all clauses pertaining to Vineyard Haven-Edgartown Road and inserting in place thereof the following revision:

EASTBOUND

Beginning at the Oak Bluffs town line,
thence easterly on Vineyard Haven-Edgartown Road
2.80 miles at 45 miles per hour
0.13 " " 30 " " " ending at Main Street;
the total distance being 2.93 miles.

WESTBOUND

Beginning 660 feet west of Main Street,
thence westerly on Vineyard Haven-Edgartown Road
2.82 miles at 45 miles per hour ending at the Oak
Bluffs town line; the total distance being 2.82 miles.

Operation of a motor vehicle at a rate of speed in excess of these limits shall be prima facie evidence that such speed is greater than is reasonable and proper.

The provisions of this regulation shall not, however, abrogate in any sense Chapter 90, Section 14, of the General Laws (Ter. Ed.).
